We We tried to work the grey horse haven't got but about 5 acres ~~thickly~~ but he fell down so I had me put in 45. He had a good deal couldn't get him hitched up, so we of trouble in getting started. went down after Bart Top again.

couldn't get her in the corral but Mr. Weger with help she jumped the fence and came home Hoping that you will get well soon and we caught her. We started to put my rain Astorby but we broke the stick the double trees are fastened to and we had a run one and started again but we broke that to and made another one that would not break.

The Stock are all looking well. The pig is fat enough to kill. We make plenty of butter for our mice and a ran mia to. The cows we keep up give about $1\frac{1}{2}$ gallons a day. Ponze calf is nearly well now. We are only giving one egg a day. The turkeys are looking fine.

The Indians came down and wanted more grub, We gave them enough from here to last them all week and got them 50 worth of coffee from the store. He is going to pay.
