26 Leaving a balance due said administrator, Oliver Teller
27 in the sum of \$28.37, which said sum has been advanced
28 by him, and which sum he hereby waives, and hereby waives
29 any future claim, demand or charge for said \$28.37 in
30 any manner whatever, and asks that the estate be closed
31 and that he may be dismissed as administrator, hereby further
32 waiving any claim or claim that he has for services as
33 administrator or any other sum whatever.

1 On the 15th day of March, 1930, petitioner was granted
2 letters of administration on the estate of George W. Teller,
3 deceased, aforesaid, and ever since that time, after duly
4 qualifying for same, has been and now is the administrator

6 On the 20th day of March, 1930 administrator, (petitioner

13 showing no inheritance taxes due or payable; That

15 That said property was all in cash, United States Legal
16 tender, and in the amount of \$411.63. That there was
17 no assessment for taxes of any kind against said estate
18 nor other assessment for any reason.

19 That the claims filed and expenses of said administration
20 exceed the property by the sum of \$ 28.37, which administrator
21 herein has advanced and paid, and hereby waives any claim
22 for remuneration therefor; That deceased was the father
23 of your petitioner, (said Administrator) and therefore he
24 makes no claim for such deficiency.

hearing of this petition; That the account may be
allowed and approved, and that petitioner may be
dismissed from his duties as administrator as aforesaid,
and for such other and further relief as may be meetin
the premises.
